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- Employers identify a position they would like to offer to a student and provide a brief description of the role including the department, general responsibilities, supervisor, and schedule. Possible opportunities could include, but are not limited to, the vit tech team, irrigation department, tasting room, office, vineyards, or winery production.
- The student application period is March 1st -31st.
- Employers will receive notes and a video copy of the interviews in April to meet the students and select a student(s) to join their team
- Student will be expected to focus on the job they are hired for, but if an opportunity arises, employers are encouraged to introduce them to other aspects of the business.
- Employers are encouraged to offer students feedback and letters of recommendation if they are satisfied with their participation to help students build their resume for when they enter the workforce upon graduation or when they move on to college.

EMPLOYER DETAILS

- Program Dates: June 21 2023 -August 11 2023
- One or two high school students, 16 years or older, for the duration of the 8 week program.
- The schedule is set by the employer.
- Example: 3-4 days per week, 4-6 hours a day.
- Students will attend a soft skills training workshop every Friday morning provided by the Napa Valley Farmworker Foundation and NVUSD.
- A student internship expectation agreement will be signed by both the employer and student to ensure that expectations are met and provide for terms to end agreement if necessary
- Student are employed by the host company and paid \$17/hour.
